

Turkish Rug

Look at the numbers along the side of the rug. Each number stands for a different color. Color each space on the rug according to its number. A space without a number is not colored. Cut out the rug. Cut along the dotted lines on each end to make a fringe.



- 1 = Black
- 2 = Blue OR Red
- 3 = Yellow

Did You Know?

Different regions use different patterns, so the pattern of a rug tells you where it's from.

Turkish rugs have been made for thousands of years. A good rug maker can tie about 8,000 knots a day. At this rate, a rug still takes weeks or months to make. A museum-quality rug with over 1,000 knots per inch can take 10 years to make! That makes rugs very valuable. In some places, you can still pay your taxes with rugs.
